WIDELY used as a location for Hollywood films, including the Matrix and The Mask, the awardwinning Sydney Showground offers a choice of more than 20 venues and hosts more than 350 events a year.

Its centrepiece, The Dome — a spectacular structure and the largest of its kind in the southern hemisphere - has a maximum capacity for conferences of 10,000 (with tiered seating) and a top capacity for functions of 5000.

The Dome, when combined with exhibition halls 2, 3 and 4, offers 22,000sqm of floor space. Beyond The Dome, the rest of the showground spans an area of 30 hectares, and attracts world-class events as well as major domestic and international trade shows and conferences.

The main arena in the centre of the site forms the focal point for the Sydney Royal Easter Show — the seventh largest event in the world — and caters for 10,000 seated and a further 10,000 on the grassy banks around the show-ring. The venue is also an excellent open area for corporate team building activities, with separate function and training rooms available in the council stand.

In Australia's capital city, The Hall at the National Museum in Canberra is a grand venue for large corporate and private functions. It can accommodate up to 1000 guests — or 800 diners.

A bonus for function organisers is The

Hall's large projection screen. Organisers can receive tele-visual feeds from a location of their choosing or through the museum's in-house broadcast studio. The screen can also be used to project images of live speakers and performers.

Function opportunities don't stop at The Hall. The Peninsula Room is an ideal venue for a wedding, or a business function with a difference. A range of other venues, including the expansive Garden of Australian Dreams, the outdoor amphitheatre, the 177-seat Visions Theatre, the broadcast studio and outdoor terraces, are also available. There is also a range of meeting and conference rooms available for hire.

Just three years old, the museum has been used for many high-profile events, as one of the newest and most exciting venues in Canberra.

Situated on Action Peninsula, the museum has expansive views over Lake Burley Griffin, the city centre and the parliamentary zone.

Next to nature, but Mulu Resort is also minutes from the airport

It's the Royal Mulu Resort in Sarawak — a country which is home to many remarkable national parks rich with natural wonders.


In all, there are more than 10 locations of various sizes that guests can select as their own reserved area.


Its location enables corporate groups to hire the entire property for their dedicated use, while outside speakers and facilitators can also be supplied if necessary.


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
